- ii. Diversifying genetics of queen bees
- iii. \$300 for queens: Asking association to sponsor a daughter queen that Bill Sprenkle would raise, graft from the queen, and then raise new queens from the daughter
- iv. Concerns:
  - 1. Would Bill offer discounts to association members?
  - 2. The odds of the queen surviving is 2 of 10 queens succeeding and surviving
    - a. Counter point: This sponsorship would benefit the association mission statement of promoting the scientific and sustainable practice of beekeeping
- v. MAJORITY VOTE IN FAVOR OF SPONSORSHIP
- VII. Dave Papke: State of the Bees
  - a. Late Spring this year, which moved swarming back
  - b. Queen excluders
    - i. Put his on in May instead of earlier in order to give the brood more room to expand in the hive
    - ii. Drones can still escape from honey supers due to upper entrance
    - iii. Colonies are strong
    - iv. Had some more swarming the normal this year, but it's unclear that the queen excluder caused it or had no affect
- VIII. Honey containers are available. 6 packs of bottles are \$3.00. If interested in purchasing, contact Mary.
- IX. Julie Kurtz has hives for sale
- X. Coral: Woman in Littlestown has 5.2 acres of land and is interested in bees being put on her property and cared for by a beekeeper
- XI. NuBees and their stories
  - a. Brandy-beekeeping for 1 year
    - i. Always fascinated by bees
    - ii. Took Jeremy's class
    - iii. Was queen-less for a bit, but hive was creating a new queen
    - iv. Quakers were instrumental in helping her establish her hives at the Quaker meeting house
  - b. Val-beekeeping for 1 year
    - i. Interested after retirement
    - ii. Researched beekeeping, took courses, and volunteered at YCBA
    - iii. Made a spot for their bees
    - iv. Made a roof to be placed over the hives (option to place a tarp, if needed) and placed a mailbox next to the hives so that they could store their hive tools by the hives
    - v. Success over the winter
    - vi. Started a nuc in the spring
  - c. Pat-beekeeping for 3 years
    - i. First year his father gave him a hive and a bee package, and he researched beekeeping (self-taught)

- ii. First year fed the bees constantly through the fall without mite management, and they survived the winter
- iii. Bought a nuc, while adding supers on original hive
- iv. Had 50 lb of honey from original hive
- v. Dumb mistakes: Used a bee escape with the queen above it, which caused the queen to fall into the grass
- vi. Did a sugar roll test and had a mite problem
- vii. Second winter he lost the bees
- viii. Took Jeremy's class
- ix. Currently has 2 hives of bees (one strong and one weaker)
  - 1. Planning to swap strong brood and weak brood
